

Resources for Financial Assistance

This guide was compiled to inform patients of programs that may be able to assist them through times of financial hardship. Each program has its own different eligibility requirements, so while we cannot guarantee enrollment, we can recommend places to start. Feel free to speak to staff if you have questions!

Statewide programs are listed first, on pages 1-4, followed by county specific programs (counties are listed in alphabetical order).

State-Wide and Regional Programs

LIHEAP for Utilities Assistance

Program Information: This program provides a substantial amount of utilities assistance once per year per household. Their emergency funding is not always available, but their general fund is often available, especially during the first half of the year (expect about 90 days to receive funding if approved for this). If you are unexpectedly unemployed, this is a great resource to apply for.

Requirements: Typically, funding is restricted to those who have social security numbers (though sometimes). They have an income cut off as well (eligibility is based on the household income for the last 30 days).

How to Apply: There are a number of regional organizations that approve applications and distribute funds. They often have other forms of resource assistance, such as weatherization programs—feel free to look at the services listed at the individual agency websites!

- Cocke, Grainger, Hamblen, Jefferson, Monroe, and Sevier Counties residents can apply through the Douglas-Cherokee Economic Authority https://www.dcea-liheap.org/ (we recommend calling ahead to see if funding is available as they do not keep a waitlist). Can also help with rent and/or water.
- Knox County residents can apply through CAC, <u>https://www.knoxcac.org/utility-assistance/</u>. They do keep a waitlist if funding is not currently available.

PROJECT HELP (for KUB Customers)

Description: Assists KUB customers with electricity bills. **Contact**: 865-637-6700.

Hospital Financial Assistance

Description: If you have been admitted to the hospital and are having difficulty paying the hospital bills, we recommend submitting an application to the hospital for financial assistance (you may also ask about financial assistance at any follow up appointments at that hospital). Most major hospitals have a process in place, but if you have a question as to whether or not the hospital you were admitted to has a program, please let SMLC staff know. You can often submit an application for several months following your admission, even up to eight months later in the case of UT Medical Center.

Additional Recommendation: for ambulance or ER bills, call the number on the bill to see if you can set up a payment plan to pay just a little each month.

Lifeline Phone Service Assistance

Description: Provides monthly benefits for phone or internet services. **Eligibility Requirements**: There is an income requirement, and as I government program, benefits are only available to US citizens.

American Job Center for Employment Assistance

Description: American Job Centers can assist those looking for employment or having employment difficulties. They have centers across the state and resources are also available online. Of particular interest to our patients, they can assist with how to search for a job and resume writing. You can also search for jobs online by keyword, employer, education, skills, salary, location, etc. and apply for positions online. For those in migrant or seasonal farm work, they can assist with advocacy, placement and support services if needed.

Pharmacy Discount Cards

GoodRx

We are able to provide any patient with a GoodRx discount card—ask at your next appointment for one if you do not have one. Good Rx can reduce the cost of some medications when shown at the pharmacy, though not all medications are covered. Pharmacies often carry them as well so you can ask when you go to pick up your medications.

CoverRx

Those who do have a social security card can also apply for CoverRx. The application is avalaible online and only takes a few minutes to complete. SMLC staff can assist with enrollment as well, in person or over the phone. Cover Rx does have an income cut off so not all will qualify. Enrollment is for a year at a time, so re-enrollment will be necessary. Application link: https://new.optumrx.com/coverrx.

Veterans Benefits

If you are a veteran, or have lost a spouse who was a veteran, and believe that you are not receiving all the benefits available for veterans, we recommend contacting the State of Tennessee in their Department of Veteran Services for a Veteran's Service Officer. You may also let clinic staff know, and we can make a direct referral.

Mercy Medical Angels: Long Distance Medical Transportation

Description: Those needing to travel over 50 miles each way to a medical appointment can apply for a gas card or bus fare (or air travel for 200+ miles) through Mercy Medical Angels.

How to Apply: Complete an application online at <u>https://www.mercymedical.org/request-assistance</u>. They do require support document uploads. Assistance is only for appointments scheduled within 45 days of the application date.
